ALUMINUM RECYCLING - Recycling 1 ton of aluminum:

- Saves 14,000 kWh of energy
- Saves 1,663 gallons of oil
- Saves 237.6 million Btu's of energy
- Saves 10 cubic yards of landfill space

PAPER RECYCLING - Recycling 1 ton of paper:

- Saves 4,100 kWh of energy
- Saves 380 gallons of oil
- Saves 7,000 gallons of water
- Saves 17 trees

PLASTICS RECYCLING - Recycling 1 ton of plastic:

- Saves 5,774 kWh of energy
- Saves 685 gallons of oil
- Saves 30 cubic yards of landfill space





Early voting has started in Utah County and will run through November 4th. The rotunda in the Orem City Center is the only Orem location for early voting. If the Orem schedule won't work for you, there are several alternate locations and schedules available including the Provo Recreation Center which will be open for early voting from 10 a.m. to 6 p.m.. If you are registered in Utah County you can vote at any voting location. **There are no City of Orem issues or candidates on the ballot.**

OREM FALL CLEAN-UP • FREE DUMPPASS

Pass is good for one pickup truck or single-axle trailer load of mixed HOUSEHOLD TRASH. Loads should be stacked no higher than the sides of the vehicle bed or trailer. All loads must be covered as required by the transfer station. For larger loads, this pass will only cover the first \$8.00 of the station's fee and the user must pay the difference.

Multiple dump passes CANNOT be combined to pay for larger loads

No commercial construction/demolition materials are accepted

YOUR GARBAGE & RECYCLING PICK-UP DAY MAY BE CHANGING



In an effort to improve customer service, Waste Management and the City of Orem have consolidated all recycling customers' pick-ups to a single week. A few neighborhoods will also be assigned a new service pick-up day. You can check your service day by visiting orem.org/WM and searching your address.

Recycling in Orem:

Recycling is still collected every other week.

Most recycling collection occurs every other week on the same day as your trash collection.

Please make sure that all recyclables fit in your recycle container.

Place your recycling and trash container at the curb between sundown on the day before collection and 7:00 a.m. the day of collection.

If you see a tanker at a manhole, do not approach it, but try to collect any information you can (e.g. license plate number or company name). In the past few months, someone has been illegally dumping into the city's sewers and causing serious issues at the treatment plant.
